HANDOUT-ABLE: Bedside Swallow Evaluation Results/Recommendations Sheet

A speech pathologist has evaluated the patient based upon: medical history, investigation of possible signs/symptoms of aspiration, an oral-mechanism examination, analysis of data from family/caregiver reporting, consideration of behavioral factors and direct testing via a bedside swallow evaluation -- with trials of oral intake with various consistencies, and with attempts at multiple strategies, as indicated.

The following has been recommended (for safety) -- due to results from this bedside swallow evaluation:

It is recommended these consistencies/strategies be utilized until testing can be re-conducted.

In addition, the following general guidelines for safe swallowing are recommended: elevate/keep upright as close to 90 degrees as possible for all oral intake (posture like sitting in a chair), avoid talking during swallowing, and remain upright as close to 90 degrees for at least 30 minutes after meals.

These recommendations are for the **current** status of swallowing. If the patient experiences as decline in functioning, contact nursing or a provider immediately to contact the speech pathologist regarding details on changes in swallowing -- so that the patient can be urgently re-assessed for possible new recommendations.
